We are excited to announce the launch of a new scholarship program for students enrolled in the College of Fine Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences who wish to take advantage of these programs during the Summer of 2014. Travel to London, Paris, Athens, Dublin and other destinations with a UMass Lowell faculty member and enrich your academic, cultural, and geographical knowledge while earning course credit (3- and 6-credit courses available).

The college will award 25 scholarships of \$400 each to defray the costs of student travel. Additional scholarships may be available from Online and Continuing Education, and individual Departments and Programs.

To apply for a World Ready Scholarship, submit an unofficial copy of your transcript, along with a completed scholarship application (attached) to the Dean's office (150 Wilder St.) by December 15, 2013.
